



This article, Weird, extinct amphibian had a rapid-fire 'slingshot' tongue, originally appeared on CNET.com.

Step aside, chameleons. There was once another speedy tongue making sticky waves in the animal kingdom. A new study, published in Science on Thursday, establishes the now-extinct amphibians known as albanerpetontids (or albies) as the earliest users of a slingshot-style tongue, used to snatch prey from the air by contracting and launching at great speed.

A set of 99-million-year old albie fossils, discovered in Myanmar, also introduce the world to a new species, *Yaksha perettii*. Based on the size of the skull, scientists were able to estimate an adult size of approximately to the tail. Knowing they had this ballistic tongue gives us a whole new understanding of this entire lineage."


